N preparation for the submission of Myanma Thanaka cultural tradition to UNESCO's Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity before March 2025, educational programmes on Thanaka culture are being conducted throughout February at museums and libraries under the Ministry of Religious Affairs and Culture.

Students from various schools in Nay Pyi Taw were invited to the National Museum (Nay Pyi Taw) for an educational session on Thanaka culture on 7 February. Deputy Minister for Religious Affairs and Culture Daw Nu Mra Zan delivered a lecture on the history of

At the National Museum (Nay Pyi Taw), various activities are being held as part of the educational programmes, including exhibitions of explanatory texts and documentary videos on Thanaka, students' poetry recitations related to Thanaka and hands-on demonstrations where participants can grind and apply Thanaka themselves. — MNA/KZL

Myanmar begins zero-tariff maize exports to Thailand

MYANMAR have started to ship maize to Thailand under Customs Tariff exemption, maize traders

Thailand gives the green light for maize imports under zero tariff (with Form D), between 1 February and 31 August. Howev-

er, Thailand imposes a maximum tax rate of 73 per cent on maize imports to protect the rights of their growers if the maize is imported during the maize season of Thailand. Therefore, traders are stocking them to export under duty exemption.

Myanmar's maize is primarily exported to the Philippines, Vietnam and India through maritime trade. They are also sent to neighbouring countries

Myanmar shipped 1.88 million tonnes of maize in the eight months of the current financial year 2024-2025 beginning 1 April, bagging US\$477 million, according to Myanmar Pulses, Beans, Maize and Sesame Seeds Merchants Association.

Myanmar exports around two million tonnes of maize. The corn is cultivated in Shan, Kachin, Kayah and Kayin states and Mandalay, Sagaing and Magway regions. Myanmar has three corn seasons — winter, summer and monsoon. Myanmar's annual corn output is estimated at 2.5-3 million tonnes. — NN/KK



Residents Urged to Prioritize Public Safety Amid Armed Terrorist Threats

ARMED terrorists have been launching attacks by using residential homes and administrative buildings in towns and villages as cover, where they have forcibly settled. They aim to shield themselves from Tatmadaw counterattacks while also persuading temporarily displaced persons to return to their native areas and recruiting new members. That enables terrorists to use civilians as human shields. Tatmadaw is committed to safeguarding the sovereignty of the State and will respond to these threats based on intelligence and prevailing conditions. Therefore, residents in areas where terrorists have taken control must prioritize their safety and protect themselves from being exploited by these groups.

Myanmar, China discuss strengthening legal cooperation

UNION Minister for Legal Affairs and Attorney-General of the Union Dr Thida Oo met Ms Ma Jia, Chinese Ambassador to Myanmar, and her delegation yesterday afternoon at the diplomatic hall of the Ministry of Legal Affairs in Nay Pyi Taw.

During the meeting, both sides discussed enhancing legal cooperation between the two countries, particularly on telecom fraud crimes, cross-border offences, online gambling and drug-related cases. They also exchanged views on provisions regarding the general elections under the Constitution, as well as

the possibility of the Union Minister and Attorney-General of the Union serving as an Honorary Professor at the University of Political Science and Law in China. They then discussed necessary support for diploma courses and training programmes conducted at the Legal Awareness Centre (LAC). — MNA/KZL

Power supply expands in Yangon eastern district townships

AS of 13 February, the power supply schedule has been extended to a four-hour on, and four-hour off scheme in Yangon Eastern District, which includes Tamway Township, South Okkala Township, Dagon Myothit (Seikkan) Township, Dagon Myothit (South) Township, Dagon Myothit (North) Township,

Dagon Myothit (East) Township, Dawbon Township, Pazundaung Township, Botahtaung Township, Mingala Taungnyunt Township, North Okkalapa Township, Yankin Township, Thingangyun Township and Thakayta Township, from the previous four-hour on and eight-hour off schedule.

The four-hour on, four-hour off scheme was back in Yangon Western District on 3 February after the 230 kV Shweli-Mangsi transmission line was repaired.

"Of two Shweli-Mangsi transmission lines, the 230 kV line was repaired but the other one, which also has 350-400 megawatts, has yet to be repaired due to the security concern," said an official from the Ministry of Electric Power. — Htun Htun/ZS

Notice for mineral (gold) trading licence

THE Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation has notified on 30 October 2024 that the gold shop owners have to apply for gold trading licences following Notification 055/2024 released on 25 October 2024 and will have to face legal action under Section 5 of the Essential Supplies and Services Law if they fail to do so.

It has already been announced in newspapers issued on 7 November 2024 to start applying for a gold trading licence on 18 November 2024, and the process will end within three months on 17 February 2025. The newspaper issued on 11 December 2024 also mentioned that those who do not apply for the licences will face legal action under Section 5 of the Essential Supplies and Services Law.

The three-month duration of the licence application date from 18 November 2024 to 17 February 2025 is approaching to expire. Therefore, businesspeople should apply for the licence during a fixed duration and those who fail to do so will face legal action under Section 5 of the Essential Supplies and Services Law.

THE Nay Pyi Taw Water Fountain Garden is under renovation and expansion into the Royal Garden at a cost of over K15 billion.

The Nay Pyi Taw Water Fountain Garden, which was first built in 2008 and is now 17 years old, is being renovated and expanded into the Royal Garden in line with the urban character of the developing Nay Pyi Taw Council Area. The renovation and new construction are carried out in three phases. The first phase involves four types of upgrades and 14 types of new construction. The second phase involves 14 types of new construction, and the third phase involves 17 types of new construction, making a total of 49 projects. Of the 45 new construction projects, modern children's playgrounds, new parks, and large

figures are being included, and 14 have already been completed.

A total of 36 teams participated in the Thanaka performance competition, competing in different styles of applying Thanaka paste.



Mineral trading licences mandatory by deadline

ONLY a few days are left to seek a gem trading licence and those who fail to do so by the deadline will face legal actions, the Mineral (Gold) Reference Price Determination Committee stated.

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation notified gold shop owners of seeking a gem trading licence within three months of the notification (18 November 2024 to 17 February 2025) and failing to obtain a licence will be subject to legal action.

Over 1,000 application forms have been taken out and

over 700 have been submitted so far, according to the Initial Evaluation Committee on Yangon Region Mineral (Gold) Trading Service.

The ministry stated that those who run gold transaction service businesses must comply with rules and regulations under Notification 055/2024 released on 25 October 2024. Entities failing to obtain a licence within the set timeframe or conducting gold transactions without adhering to reference prices will face penalties under Section 5 of the Essential Sup-

plies and Services Law.

The Mineral (Gold) Reference Price Determination Committee issues daily gold reference prices for a tical of pure gold (16.329325 grammes) with 19.25 grammes of the density of gold starting from 6 December through MRTV, MWD, the MoNREC website www.mining. gov.mm and YGEA Facebook page.

The committee set pure gold at K5.49 million per tical (16.329325 grams) with 19.25 grams of the density of gold on 13 February 2025. — NN/KK


Public Notice

Such objects are often of great historical value or considered priceless, contributing to both historical evidence and national prestige. Therefore, citizens should take pride in their role in preserving and protecting the country's ancient cultural heritage by handing over these objects to the relevant authorities. At this point, it is crucial to

raise public awareness about the value of ancient artefacts. Only when people fully understand the significance of these objects will they willingly and responsibly hand them over to the appropriate authorities. Without an emphasis on the importance of cultural heritage, individuals may resort to smuggling these artefacts out of the country through illegal channels. If so, Myanmar will risk losing its ancient treasures and vital pieces of its historical narrative.

Currently, some ancient objects from Myanmar, which are trafficked through smuggling routes, can be found in museums abroad. Some of these artefacts are even displayed in hotels, restaurants, and the homes of wealthy individuals. This misuse is deeply regrettable for all Myanmar citizens, as it tarnishes the image of the nation and its cultural heritage.

People must take steps to prevent the loss of Myanmar's cultural heritage by preserving ancient objects in all their forms. Myanmar has the rightful ownership of its ancient artefacts and full rights to possess and display them as part of cultural preservation. Furthermore, it is crucial to understand that anyone who intentionally or unintentionally smuggles these ancient objects whether to other countries or through smugglers – will face legal consequences for their actions.

Regardless of the circumstances, the long-term preservation of Myanmar's cultural heritage and ancient objects should be the responsibility of the relevant departments. All Myanmar citizens must cultivate a spirit of valuing and preserving cultural heritage as part of their national duty. At the same time, the relevant authorities must take action against those who violate the Protection and Preservation of Antique Objects Law.

YBER threats around the world have been increasing in number, and Myanmar has not been immune to the challenges posed by cyber threats.

When comparing Myanmar to the other ASEAN countries, its internet penetration percentage is lower. However, Myanmar's mobile telecommunications network has expanded rapidly across the nation over the past decade. This expansion has led to a substantial increase in mobile user rates.

The four major telecom operators MPT, Ooredoo, Telenor, and Mytel have played pivotal roles in this growth. The cost of a SIM card is now less than one dollar.

Digital Development in Myanmar

Myanmar's Ministry of Post and Telecommunication issues four types of telecom licences. These licenses differ based on the types of activities that they carry out, the application procedures and timeframes, and licence durations and renewal conditions.

As of 2019, 173 companies were providing internet-related services in Myanmar, including four mobile phone companies and all other types of telecommunications-related companies.

Financial Sector Reforms

In recent years, Myanmar has undertaken significant reforms in the financial sector. The Central Bank of Myanmar established Financial Network System Phase I (CBM-NET) in 2016 with the support of JICA and Financial Network System Phase II (CBM-NET2) was successfully launched on 16 November 2020. The system facilitates 24/7 domestic MMK remittance across different banks, bulk payments such as payroll transfers, and automatic withdrawal of taxes and utility bills.

The National Payment System Governing Committee, chaired by the Central Bank of Myanmar and comprising rep-

ministries, was established on 17 May 2021. The committee is responsible for implementing the National Payments System Strategy (2020-2025) and ensuring

CBM has established the necessary infrastructure and regulatory framework to enable the operation of mobile wallet services. In 2006, CBM enacted the Financial Institution Law and Mobile Financial Services Regulations. As of 2022, CBM has granted five companies, including Wave Money, OK Dollar, MPT, Ooredoo and Mytel as mobile financial service providers. Additionally, CBM has granted licences to 18 private banks for mobile banking under the Law and Regulations.

Scammers create a fake Facebook account using the KBZ Bank logo and pretend to be bank staff from KBZ Bank. These scammers contact users of mobile payment services through Messenger or Viber: Mostly, they sent a message

- "Your mobile payment application requires an upgrade from level 1 to level 2. Please upgrade now, otherwise, it will be shut down"
- "Our bank needs to verify your mobile payment account registration information. Please provide a copy of your CSC card and other necessary details." Subsequently, the scammer

logs into the payment application using the targeted phone number and waits. When the targeted user logs into the payment application and receives the OTP (One-Time Password) code sent by the bank, the scammer asks for the OTP code from the target.

After obtaining the OTP code, the scammer accesses the target's account with the OTP code and withdraws all funds

Sometimes, the scammer sends a message stating, 'We will upgrade your payment application account level. Please download and install the application first.' However, the downloaded application is actually remote access software, such as the AnyDesk application, and if you install it, the scammer gains the ability to manipulate your mobile payment

Case 2: Package Delivery Scam A scammer sent a friend re-

quest to the plaintiff through a Facebook account and established a friendship with her. Two weeks later, the scammer contacted the plaintiff and said that she was a Korean American citizen and while serving in the Syria Peacekeeping Troop she received gold bars and US dollars. She expressed difficulties due to the COVID-19 pandemic in retaining these assets and expressed a desire to entrust and deliver them to the plaintiff. The scammer also provided photographs of the gold bars and US

Two days later, the plaintiff received a phone call from a woman's voice. The caller informed her that the delivery package had arrived at the Yangon International Airport Logistic Division and a fee of US\$1,250 was required to release the package. The plaintiff remitted US\$1,250; however, the plaintiff received another phone call requesting additional US dollars for various reasons. Following the request, the plaintiff remitted around US\$5,000 to the specified

bank account.

As a result of the police investigation, it was revealed that the scammer approached an individual with limited financial means to open a bank account and then purchased that person's bank account. This account was then utilized to deceive money from the plaintiff. The police arrested a Nigerian citizen who led the deception, along with another Myanmar woman in connection with the case, and seized 57 bank accounts along with other related materials. The scammers confess that they committed 51 cases across the country in 2020.

Case 3: Online Loan Scams

Scammers create counterfeit Facebook accounts, using the identical name and logo of legitimate microfinance companies, gold and jewellery shops or banks to engage in online money lending schemes.

These scammers offer online money lending services through these counterfeit Facebook accounts. Upon encountering such a page, the plaintiff mistakenly believes it to be an authentic branch of the microfinance company, gold and jewellery shop or bank.

When the plaintiff contacts the fake accounts for the purpose of borrowing money, the scammer then requests the plaintiff to complete various forms and demands an upfront payment for registration. Once the plaintiff transfers the requested amount, the scammer subsequently asks site

for additional funds, such as fees for documents and forms

In the final stage of the deception, the scammer blocks the plaintiff's phone number.

Preventive Measure

The Myanmar government has made various efforts in recent years to tackle fraud and scams These efforts include:

- 1. Re-registration of SIM us ers with correct personal information and ID card numbers;
- 2. Cancellation of SIM cards that are incomplete or incorrectly registered;
- Registration of biometric data of citizens and the implementation of an e-ID database system:
- Scrutinizing and compar ing the SIM registration data with the biometric
- Upgrading wallet users from Level 1 to Level 2 with the correct information for the KYC (Know Your Customer) process;
- 6. Investigation and pros ecution of cybercriminal activities;
- 7. Upgrading the legal framework;
- 8. Public awareness campaigns, and so on.

Conclusion

The nature of cybercrime and its threats is complex and diverse. Cooperation and exchange of knowledge, best practices, and innovative solutions among gov ernment, the private sectors and organizations will strengthen cyber resilience and pave the way for a safer, more secure digital future.



Migratory birds flock to Bagan's ponds amid good rainfall

LARGE ponds located in the Ancient Cultural Heritage Zone of Bagan-NyaungU, Mandalay Region, have become a seasonal refuge for migratory birds.

These ponds, filled with local and regional species, see an influx of wintering birds, as reported by birdwatching guides.

The Bagan-NyaungU area, which includes Ngathayauk and Bagan City is a relatively dry region with limited rainfall, but recent good rainfall has replenished the ancient ponds, leading to an abundance of water.

This, in turn, has created an ideal environment for the hibernating birds to arrive and feed. Local bird enthusiasts said that as the ponds' water levels are still full into the winter season, the birds have found their way to the area, especially to the large ponds.

The ancient ponds like Alanbagan Lake, Alel Lake,

Laydaunt Lake, Nyaunglaphak Lake, Phoethudaw Lake (aka) Culamuni Lake, Oo Kyipway Lake, Shwenann Yintaw Lake (aka) Htein Lake, Shwehti Lake, Makyee Lake, Zeyyathut Lake, Mingala Lake, Phwa Saw Lake (Montein), Ko Mauk Lake, Kanthit Lake, Kansoontaw Monastery Lake, Manukan Maywe Lake, Oak Phoak Lake, Sel Lake, Kanthitgyi Lake, Kyaukyoe Lake and Taungkyaung Lake, as well as other large and small ponds have filled with water.

Migratory birds have been seen visiting these ponds, possibly resting during their travels. Local guides have noted that birds are often spotted perched on local plants around the ponds. In past years, these ponds received little water. But this year, they have stayed full, attracting more migratory birds. Ducks, geese and shorebirds have been observed resting there. Some birds are hard to identify without special cameras, but birdwatchers have reported a high number of birds visiting the ponds this year.

In years with good rainfall, the ponds in the Bagan-NyaungU area are usually replenished, providing a resting place for migratory birds from late autumn to early spring. — Dipa Lin// KZL

Counter-argument to false information

Security forces accused of torching homes, launching attacks using heavy weapons

MALICIOUS media outlets intentionally spread fake news, claiming that security forces set the houses ablaze and launched attacks using heavy weapons in the wards of Dabayin Township, Sagaing Region, on 12 February.

Drugs seized in Kengtung, Tangyan and Namhsam

DRUGS were seized in Kengtung, Tangyan, and Namsang townships, according to the Myanmar Police Force.

On 10 November at 7:30 pm, a combined team, including members of the Anti-Drug Police Force, stopped and searched a Toyota Hilux Revo in Kengtung Township. The vehicle was driven by Aik Kam Yong, who was accompanied by Ma Nan Seng Mo. The search led to the seizure of 39 kilogrammes of ketamine worth K331.5 million and 18 kilogrammes of crystal methamphetamine (Ice) valued at K144 million.

On 12 February at 11:30 am, the police stopped a motorbike driven by Maung Shwe Aung in Tangyan Township and found 2,000 stimulant tablets in his possession. Later that day, at 1:30 pm, officers searched his house in Tangyan Township, seizing an additional 5,500 stimulant tablets – bringing the total to 7,500 tablets worth K7.5 million – as well as 20 grammes of heroin valued at K400,000.

At midnight on 12 Febru-

ary, police searched the home of Aik Htun in Namsang Township and seized 20,050 stimulant tablets worth approximately K10 million. The offenders have been charged under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law, according to reports. — MNA/MKKS

North Korea destroys family reunion centre in 'inhumane act', Seoul says

Seoul has condemned this act as "inhumane", stating that it tramples on the earnest wishes of separated families.

NORTH Korea is demolishing a venue that for decades hosted tearful reunions of families separated by the Korean War and the division of the country, Seoul said Thursday, calling the move "inhumane".

Millions of people were swept apart by the 1950-53 Korean War, which split the peninsula and separated brothers and sisters, parents and children and husbands and wives. Hostilities ceased with an armistice rather than a peace treaty, leaving the two Koreas technically still at war and with all direct civilian exchanges prohibited.

Emotional reunions in the North's Kumgang mountain served as a testament to the devastating human cost of the division.

But the meetings were subject to the vagaries of inter-Ko-

rea politics and often used as a negotiating tool by Pyongyang. The last one was held in 2018.

"The demolition of the Mount Kumgang Reunion Center is an inhumane act that tramples on the earnest wishes of separated families," a spokesperson for Seoul's unification ministry said. South Korea "sternly urges an immediate halt to such actions" and "expresses strong regret". — AFP

Shanghai to open Harry Potter theme park in 2027

A new Harry Potter theme park will open in Shanghai in 2027, a local amusement park operator said Wednesday, becoming the first of its kind in China and the third globally following ones in London and Tokyo.

The Harry Potter studio tour is expected to cover an area spanning 53,000 square metres including both indoor and outdoor spaces at the 40-year-old Jinjiang Action Park in Shanghai's Minhang District, which will be renovated and reopened in 2027, according to Jin Jiang International Holdings Co.

The project will take visitors on a behind-the-scenes tour of the Harry Potter films, where they can explore iconic scenes, see the original costumes and props used in the movies and experience interactive installations, the company said. – Kyodo

Young Venezuelans pay homage to their fallen with painted asphalt

THE names of 320 young Venezuelans who have died in 10 years of protests against the government of President Nicolas Maduro appear in white on the black asphalt in Caracas.

The tribute, which was painted Wednesday in celebration of Youth Day along the access road to the Central University of Venezuela, honours the fallen on both sides of the political fence.

The names include that of Genesis Carmona, who was just 22 years old when she died in a crackdown on a protest in 2014. Also included is Orlando Figuera, who at the age of 21 was killed — according to the government — after being outed as a Maduro supporter.

"It is a protest to commemorate all those young people who have lost their lives... simply for raising their voices for the country they dreamed of, for the country they wanted," Miguel Angel Suarez, president of a university student federation, told AFP at the makeshift monument. — AFP

European airport passenger traffic tops pre-COVID level

EUROPEAN airports welcomed more passengers last year than in 2019, surpassing pre-COVID levels for the first time since the pandemic, industry figures showed on Wednesday.

Passenger traffic reached 2.5 billion in 2024, up 7.4 per cent from the previous year, according to provisional figures from Airports Council International (ACI) Europe.

That total was 1.8 per cent above 2019 levels, said the trade group, which represents more than 600 airports in 55 countries from western Europe to Israel and Central Asia.

Growth was mostly driven by international passenger traffic, which rose 8.8 per cent,

while the number of domestic travellers was up 2.5 per cent from the previous year and remained below pre-pandemic levels.

"Europe's airports wel-

comed an additional 200 million passengers last year, with many surpassing their previous historic records," said ACI Europe director general Olivier Jankovec. — AFP

Pope calls Trump migrant deportations a 'major crisis'

POPE Francis launched a stinging critique Tuesday of US President Donald Trump's deportations of undocumented migrants, describing it as a "major crisis" that "damages the dignity of men and women".

In a letter to US bishops, he urged Catholics and others

"not to give in to narratives that discriminate against and cause unnecessary suffering to our migrant and refugee brothers and sisters".

The Argentine pontiff, 88, has repeatedly defended the rights of migrants during his 10 years leading the Catholic

Church, urging world leaders to be more welcoming to those fleeing poverty or violence.

"I have followed closely the major crisis that is taking place in the United States with the initiation of a programme of mass deportations," he wrote Tuesday. — AFP

Jordan marks record 1.32M GCC visitors in 2024

Overnight visitors from the GCC reached more than 1.32 million in 2024, a substantial 15 per cent increase from 1.15 million visitors in 2023. The average length of stay reported growth

According to the statement, a new 500 Kwacha note (about US\$18), the note with the largest amount, will also be added.

Telecom Italia 2024 revenue rises as it eyes resuming dividend payments

TELECOM Italia, Italy's largest phone company, said Wednesday that revenue rose more than expected in 2024, boosted by its Brazilian unit, and that it could resume dividends payments next year.

Turnover at the com-

pany, whose largest shareholder is France's Vivendi, increased 3.1 per cent to 14.5 billion euros (\$15 billion) in 2024, beating an analyst consensus of a 2.9-per-cent increase.

In a statement, TIM cited a "possible return"

to paying dividends in 2026, for the first time since 2021, thanks partly to the sale of its Sparkle submarine cable division.

TIM's board of directors earlier Wednesday unanimously approved a 700-million-euro bid by the Italian state for the fibre-optic undersea network, which Rome views as a strategic asset.

"For the third year in a row we fully met the Group guidance, transforming TIM into a more solid and focused company," Chief Executive Pietro Labriola said in a statement.

TIM Brasil, which absorbed the mobile activities of local rival Oi in April 2022, saw its revenue increase 6.8 per cent to 4.4 billion euros in 2024.

In Italy's highly com-

petitive market, revenue gained 1.5 per cent to 10.2 billion euros.

Adjusted gross operating surplus, or Ebitda, jumped 10.1 per cent to 3.7 billion euros, exceeding its eight- to nine-per-cent target. — AFP

Chevron to cut 15-20% of workforce by end of 2026: company

CHEVRON will cut 15 to 20 per cent of its work-force as part of a reorganization to save money and to position the oil giant for the long-term, the company said Wednesday.

The job cuts will begin in 2025 and be mostly complete by the end of 2026, Chevron said in a statement to AFP. The moves are in line with a previous company pledge to remove \$2 to \$3 billion in "targeted structural costs" by the end of next year.

The move is expected to reduce headcount by thousands. Chevron employed 39,800 at the end of 2024, not counting service-station employees.

"Chevron is taking action to simplify our organizational structure, execute faster and more effectively, and position the company for stronger long-term competitiveness," said a statement from Chevron Vice-Chairman Mark Nelson.

"We do not take these actions lightly and will support our employees through the transition," Nelson said. "But responsible leadership requires taking these steps to improve the long-term competitiveness of our company for our people, our shareholders and our communities."

The announcement comes after Chevron last month reported annual profits of \$17.7 billion, down 17 per cent from 2023. The company returned a record \$27 billion last year to shareholders in share repurchases and dividends.

Shares of Chevron fell 1.4 per cent in early afternoon trading.—AFP

AU officials urge African unity amid global uncertainty

The opening session of the 46th Ordinary Session of the AU Executive Council began Wednesday in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

THE shifting global landscape, along with current shocks and uncertainties, should serve as a wake-up call for Africa to enhance its collective unity and seek permanent solutions to the continent's development and security challenges under the auspices of the African Union (AU), AU officials said Wednesday. "The current global evolution, which is quite concerning and full of uncertainties, invites us to choose the best path for ourselves and to continue making efforts to find sustainable solutions to Africa's challenges," said Mohamed Salem Ould

Merzoug, Mauritania's minister of foreign affairs and chairperson of the AU Executive Council for 2024.

Merzoug made the remarks while addressing the opening session of the 46th Ordinary Session of the Executive Council of the AU, which began Wednesday at the headquarters of the 55-member pan-African bloc in the Ethiopian capital, Addis Ababa.

He said the past year has witnessed various crises both in Africa and the rest of the world, including the ongoing Ukraine crisis, the Palestine-Israel conflict, and conflicts and security challenges in different parts of Africa.

"We should learn from the current uncertainties that finding a collective solution must be a permanent concern for us. The only alternative we have is to strengthen our continental organization, the AU, which should be the primary platform for advancing our continental projects and aspirations," he said. The sentiment was echoed by African foreign ministers and other AU officials attending the AU Executive Council meeting. — Xinhua

Israeli troops to remain in S Lebanon despite withdrawal deadline: spokesman

Israeli forces will remain in southern Lebanon despite an approaching deadline for their withdrawal, an Israeli military spokesman said Wednesday, warning civilians against returning to the area.

"The IDF remains deployed in the area. Therefore, movement southward is prohibited," Avichai Adraee, an Israel Defence Forces (IDF) spokesman, wrote on social media platform X.

"For your safety, you are forbidden from returning to your homes in the affected areas until further notice," he warned. "Anyone moving south is putting themselves in danger." Adraee said the implementation period of the ceasefire agreement "has been extended" but did not specify by whom or provide evidence of an extension. — Xinhua

Ireland support for Palestinians has country's Jews on edge

IRELAND'S tiny Jewish community fears that growing anti-Israel hostility since the start of the Gaza war is leading to increased anti-Semitism, raising questions about their future in the EU country.

Ireland has been among the most outspoken critics of Israel's response to the 7 October 2023 attacks on southern Israel by Hamas militants that sparked the war in Gaza.

Polls since the start of the war have shown overwhelming pro-Palestinian sympathy in Ireland. A survey in June by the news site The Journal found that 76 per cent of Irish people believed the EU should impose economic trade sanctions on Israel over the conflict. — AFP

Grenade blast in French bar wounds 12

TWELVE people were wounded when a grenade exploded in a bar in France's southeastern city of Grenoble on Wednesday, officials said.

"Someone came in and threw a grenade, apparently without saying a word, and ran away," prosecutor Francois Touret-de-Courcy told journalists at the scene, where emergency workers had cordoned off the area. Two people were in critical condition, he said, adding that "many clients" were present when the grenade exploded, shortly after 8:00 pm (1900 GMT) at the bar in the Olympic Village neighbourhood, built when the picturesque city hosted the 1968 Winter Olympics.

Touret-de-Courcy said investigators had not yet identified a motive but did not believe it was a "terrorist attack".

"There's nothing to make us think it's linked to terrorism," he said, calling it an "act of extreme violence" that "may be linked to a settling of scores". — Xinhua

Constantine Tassoulas elected as Greece's new president

CONSTANTINE Tassoulas, former speaker of the Greek Parliament, was elected as the country's new president on Wednesday.

Tassoulas, the nominee of the ruling conservative New Democracy (ND) party, secured 160 votes in the fourth round of voting, the same as in the previous rounds. The other three candidates each received fewer than 50 votes.

A total of 276 members of parliament took part in Wednesday's vote. Under the Greek Constitution, a candidate needs at least 151 votes in the 300-member assembly to win the presidency in the fourth round, a threshold lowered from 180 votes in the third

round and 200 votes in the first two rounds held over the past three weeks.

Tassoulas, a seasoned politician from the ND party, served as Minister of Culture and Sports in 2014 and has been elected Speaker of the Greek Parliament three times by a large majority since 2019. — Xinhua

Ancelotti is likely to rely on players such as Brahim Diaz, Arda Guler, and perhaps young defender Jacobo Ramon at the notoriously difficult El Sadar Stadium. — Xinhua

Jackson injury leaves Chelsea short of firepower until April

CHELSEA will be without striker Nicolas Jackson until after the next international break, leaving the club without a recognized "number 9" until the start of April.

The Senegalese forward, who has nine goals in the Premier League this season, tore his hamstring against West Ham a fortnight ago and although the club had hoped the injury was not serious, the BBC reports that scans have now shown Jackson could be sidelined for almost two months.

Chelsea also lost 19-year-old former Barcelona forward Marc Guiu in the same game after he suffered a groin strain after coming on to replace Jackson. Chelsea coach Enzo Maresca has admitted Guiu will be out of action for "weeks or months".

The confirmation of Jackson's injury leaves Cole Palmer as Chelsea's main attacking threat, with Christopher Nkunku giving support, although despite Palmer's 14 league goals, he is not a central striker, operating in a slightly deeper rule, while Nkunku has only two league goals and is happier operating as a second striker or an attacking midfielder. — Xinhua

With supporters breaking on to the pitch, stewards and police became involved before Slot and assistant Sipke Hulshoff were also sent off by referee Michael Oliver.

"Liverpool head coach Arne Slot was dismissed at the end of the Merseyside derby for using offensive, insulting, or abusive language," the Premier League said in a statement.

"He is handed a two-match touchline ban as a result".

The matches affected are Sunday's game against struggling Wolves at home and Liverpool's trip to Aston Villa on 19 February. — AFP

Saudi Arabia to invest \$5 bln in AI data centre

A Saudi company will invest \$5 billion to build an artificial intelligence data centre in the futuristic city of NEOM, state media reported.

between DataVolt and NEOM, would fund the creation of a fully sustainable AI data centre with a 1.5 gigawatt capacity, the official SPA news agency said.

The project will be located in Oxagon, an industrial city within NEOM, which the kingdom aims to transform into the world's largest floating industrial complex.

The NEOM project, unveiled by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, features a mirrored building dubbed The Line stretching 170 kilometres (105 miles) across the desert from the Gulf of Agaba.

When announcing The The agreement, signed Line in 2022, Prince Mohammed said it would house more than one million residents by 2030 and nine million by 2045.
